The following order was passed:

CORNELIUS HOOPER v. JOSEPHINE HOOPER.

Court of Appeals Case No. A19D0177

The writ of certiorari to grant Hooper's application for discretionary appeal, which the Court of Appeals had dismissed, is granted.

All the Justices concur.

This Court is particularly concerned with the following issue:

Did the Court of Appeals err in dismissing petitioner's discretionary application to appeal as untimely? Compare *Islamkhan v. Khan*, 299 Ga. 548 (787 SE2d 731) (2016), with *O'Leary v. Whitehall Const.*, 288 Ga. 790 (708 SE2d 353) (2011).

Hooper's notice of appeal, directed to this Court, must be filed in the trial court within ten (10) days of the date shown above. Upon filing of a notice of appeal, the trial court clerk is directed as promptly as possible to transmit the notice of appeal and the record to this Court. Once the record is received from the trial court and docketed in this Court, notices will be mailed to all counsel showing

the date of docketing and the case number assigned, which will be an “A” direct appeal case rather than a “G” granted certiorari case.
